Item #2 - Grant Funds Project Summary November 2024

AB 2766 (\$4 DMV Fee)

\$655,000 Annually by Monthly Distribution

These fees fund the District's Mobile Source Emission Reductions (MSER) Grant Program. The funds must be used on eligible projects that <u>reduce</u> air pollution from motor vehicles and for related planning, monitoring, enforcement, and technical studies necessary for the implementation of the California Clean Air Act of 1988. **Funding Limits:** No surplus emission reductions or cost-effectiveness limit requirements.

Current Balance: \$625,351.00

AB 923 (\$2 DMV Fee)

\$614,000 Annually by Monthly Distribution

These fees fund the District's Mobile Source Emission Reductions (MSER) Grant Program. The funds must be used on eligible projects that <u>remediate</u> air pollution harms created by motor vehicles. These funds may also be used on Carl Moyer eligible projects; unregulated agriculture vehicles and equipment; school bus projects; light-duty vehicle retirement program; and alternative fuel and electric infrastructure projects.

Funding Limits: Surplus emission reductions required. Subject to CARB's cost-effectiveness limit.

Current Balance: \$1,892,890.00

Carl Moyer Program (CMP)

\$1,389,487.00 FY 23/24 Allocation Pending

Carl Moyer Program (CMP) funds are used toward projects eligible under the Carl Moyer Program Guidelines. Program goals are to gain early or extra emission reductions by retrofitting, repowering, or replacing older more polluting engines with newer, cleaner engines including zero and near zero emission technologies. CMP funding categories include on-road heavy-duty vehicles, off-road equipment, light-duty passenger vehicles, lawn mower replacement and alternative fuel infrastructure projects.

Funding Limits: Surplus emission reductions required. Subject to CARB's cost-effectiveness limit.

Current Balance: \$1,237,937.00

AB 134 Community Air Protection Program (CAPP) Incentives

\$967,560 FY 23/24

Community Air Protection Program (CAPP) funds are used toward eligible projects under the CAPP and CMP Guidelines. Eligible projects must also be needed and supported within the community. These funds are focused on replacing older polluting engines, operating in disadvantaged and low-income communities, with newer, cleaner engines with a priority for zero-emissions. Funding categories include on-road heavy-duty vehicles, off-road equipment, light duty passenger vehicles, lawn mower replacement and alternative fuel infrastructure projects.

Funding Limits: Surplus emission reductions required. Subject to CARB's cost-effectiveness limit.

SUMMARY: This item authorizes \$50,000 in Mobile Emission Reductions Program (AB 2766) funds to the District's ongoing grant program used to incentivize the purchase of light-duty alternative fuel vehicles.

BACKGROUND: In June 2006, the AVAQMD Board (the Board) established an incentive program to off-set the incremental cost associated with the purchase of natural gas-fueled vehicles and refueling units. In April 2011, the Board expanded the Alternative Fuel Vehicle (AFV) program to include all alternative fuel vehicles including electric and electric/hybrid vehicles. In March 2013, the Board approved new eligibility criteria limiting the District incentives to new AFV purchase or lease agreements made with local Dealerships, and one incentive per household. In September 2013, the Board approved to offer up to 50 percent of the current incentive to local residents who purchase or lease with Dealerships outside the District due to availability. In June 2014, the Board approved to continue the AFV program decreasing the incentive to \$1,000 and discontinuing the home refueling and charging incentives. In August 2019, the Board approved a pilot program to assist AV low-income residents in purchasing EVs new or pre-owned with an incentive up to \$2,500. In March 2022, the Board approved amendments to the Alternative Fuel Vehicle Incentive Program that reduced the incentive offered from \$1,000 to \$500 for all eligible participants and eliminated the incentive for vehicles purchased outside of AV Dealerships and online.

REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION: Governing Board authorization is needed for the use of District funds. Additionally, Governing Board authorization is needed for the Executive Director/APCO and staff to make changes to the program work plan.

SUMMARY: This item awards an amount not to exceed \$7,000 to Desert Haven Enterprises to upgrade their existing lawn and garden equipment charging station. An upgrade to their existing charging station is necessary to support charging of additional batteries to sustain their all electric lawn and garden equipment fleet.

BACKGROUND: In February of 2022 the Board approved funding to Desert Haven for a proposed three-stage transition of their gasoline-powered lawn and garden equipment to zero-emissions battery-electric. Desert Haven's operations extend throughout the District at various locations, also located in low-income communities, that include school zones where school-aged children and other sensitive receptors are exposed to the air pollution caused by gasoline engines. Desert Haven's successful transition in becoming a Green Zone Certified operation encourages early adoption of commercial-grade zero-emissions lawn and garden equipment and paves a path for other commercial operations to realize transition is attainable and environmentally beneficial.

REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION: Governing Board approval is needed for the use of District funds. Additionally, Governing Board authorization is needed for the Executive Director/APCO and staff to negotiate and execute an agreement with the grant recipient.

SUMMARY: This item awards an amount not to exceed \$55,900 in Mobile Source Emission Reductions Program (AB 923) funds to Miguel Arroyo for the replacement of an older diesel tractor with a diesel skid-steer certified to the Final Tier 4/current emission standards.

BACKGROUND: AVAQMD received an application from Miguel Arroyo requesting grant funding to assist in the replacement of a 1967 diesel tractor with a 2024 diesel skidsteer Tier 4 final. Miguel Arroyo proposes voluntary participation in the equipment replacement program to reduce emissions by early retirement of older diesel farm equipment for new, cleaner diesel that meets the current emission standards. Staff has evaluated the proposed project and finds it eligible for 80 percent of the replacement cost. Retirement of the older diesel equipment produces an estimated .35tons/yr. early emission reductions. Early fleet turnover provides emission reductions that help the Valley towards attainment of the national ambient air quality standards.

REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION: Governing Board approval is needed for the use of District funds. Additionally, Governing Board authorization is needed for the Executive Director/APCO and staff to negotiate and execute an agreement with the grant recipient.
