The APCO shall establish and include in the annual operating Budget of the District a commitment of the fund balance as Cash Reserves equivalent to 30% of total General Fund Revenue.

SUBJECT: FINANCIAL RESERVES

POLICY:

It is the policy of the Governing Board of the Antelope Valley Air Quality Management District (District) to direct the Air Pollution Control Officer (APCO) to establish and maintain certain fund balances to ensure the sound fiscal management of District resources. This policy is designed to conform to Government Accounting Standards Board Statement No. 54 (GASB 54).

AMPLIFICATION OF POLICY:

A. General

Generally Accepted Accounting Principles require that sufficient funds be retained by the District to provide stability to District financial resources at all times. As such, the District must maintain a fund balance sufficient to fund District operations and to provide financial reserves for unanticipated expenditures and/or revenue shortfalls of an emergency nature. The committed, assigned and unassigned fund balance in the General Fund is considered unrestricted.

The District believes that sound financial management principles require that sufficient funds be retained by the District to provide a stable financial base at all times. To retain this stable financial base, the District needs to maintain unrestricted fund balance in its funds sufficient to fund cash flows of the District and to provide financial reserves for unanticipated expenditures and/or revenue shortfalls of an emergency nature. All committed, assigned and unassigned fund balance in the General Fund is considered unrestricted.

The purposes of the District's fund balance policy include maintaining prudent level of financial resources to protect against reducing service levels or raising fees because of temporary revenue shortfalls or unpredicted one-time expenditures. Another purpose is to reserve funds for unanticipated large expenditures, such as capital expenses; or extraordinary costs associated with defending the District's regulatory activities.

B. Classification of Funds

The following classifications conform to GASB 54. Examples are provided to illustrate how the classification might be used in practice.

- 1. Non-spendable Fund Balance includes amounts that are not in spendable form (tangible assets such as property, inventory), or are required to remain intact, and will never convert to cash. The District is likely to report these as Capital or Fixed Assets.
- 2. Restricted Fund Balance includes amounts that can be spent only for the specific purposes stipulated by the external source, government code, enabling legislation, or other legal restriction. The District is likely to establish separate trust funds for these funding types; for example: Mobile Emission Reduction Revenue (AB 2766), Incentive Based Emission Reduction Funding (AB 23), and Carl Moyer Grant Program Funds are held in separate trust accounts and are reported separate from the District's General Fund. This category could be further distinguished as follows:
 - a. Special Revenue Funds. Special revenue funds are created to account for the proceeds of specific revenue sources that are legally restricted to expenditure for specified purposes.
 - b. Debt Service Funds. Debt service funds contain specific debt reserve amounts that are subject to the requirements set forth by the ordinances or resolutions that authorize the issuance of debt. It is the District's policy that debt reserve requirements for any outstanding debt issue will be consistent with the resolution authorizing the issuance of debt.
- 3. Committed Fund Balance are designated and described by specific policy and includes amounts that can be used only for the specific purposes determined by a formal action of the Governing Board. Commitments may be changed only by action of the Governing Board. The District's Operating Cash Reserves is an example of this classification.
- 4. Assigned Fund Balance is used to describe the portion of the fund balance that reflects the intended use of resources; the intent being established by the Governing Board, or the Board's designee. From time to time the Governing Board may establish other designations of fund balance through the budget process. Such fund balance will be allocated and defined in the District's annual adopted budget.
- 5. Unassigned Fund Balance is the net resources not allocated to the categories as described above.

C. Establishment of Specific Funds

1. Cash Reserve

The APCO shall establish and include in the annual operating Budget of the District a commitment of the fund balance as Cash Reserves equivalent to 30% of total General Fund Revenue.

Operating Cash Reserve

The APCO shall establish and include in the annual operating Budget of the District a commitment of the fund balance as an Operating Cash Reserve in the amount equivalent to the operating expenses (the combined total of budget categories Salaries & Benefits and Supplies and Services) required for ninety (90) days of District operations (calculated as 25% of the annual amounts budgeted). In no case shall the Operating Cash Reserve be more than 25% of the total expenditure budget for the current fiscal year.

2. Budgetary Reserves

RECOMMENDATION: 1) Authorize the acceptance of Community Air Protection (CAP) Funding; 2) Accept the terms and conditions for the funds; and 3) Authorize the Executive Director/APCO and staff to execute the agreement, approved as to legal form, and to negotiate and execute agreements for eligible projects.

SUMMARY: This action formally accepts the Community Air Protection Funding in the amount of \$500,000 allocated to the AVAQMD. The funding consists of \$468,750 for projects and \$31,250 for administrative. This action also accepts the terms and conditions for the funds as appropriated under Schedule 3 of AB 134 in the amended Budget Act of 2017, and authorizes staff to negotiate and execute project agreements consistent with the terms and conditions.

BACKGROUND: On September 16, 2017, the Governor approved AB 134 to amend the Budget Act of 2017. This amendment adds appropriations to the Budget Act of 2017, taking effect immediately as a Budget Bill. Under Schedule 3 of this Bill, \$250 million is to be distributed by CARB to air districts for implementation of projects pursuant to the Carl Moyer Program. The purpose of the funds are to support Greenhouse Gas reductions and early actions that reduce emissions and improve public health in communities with high burdens of cumulative pollutant exposure, consistent with the goals of Assembly Bill (AB) 617 (Chapter 254, Statutes of 2017). The Air District will select projects eligible under the Carl Moyer Program 2017 Guidelines focusing in particular on vehicles and equipment that operate in any AB 617 communities.

REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION: CARB requires the Governing Board formally approve District acceptance of the funds and participation in the program.

SUMMARY: This action formally accepts the Voluntary NOx Remediation Measure Funding in the amount of \$26,634 allocated to the AVAQMD, approves the District's participation pursuant to the NRM Funding Guidelines, and authorizes staff to negotiate and execute project agreement with grantee.

BACKGROUND: California Air Resources Board staff have found that although biodiesel use is health beneficial overall, biodiesel can, in certain engines, contribute to an increase in oxides of nitrogen (NOx). As a result, CARB has established a program to fund reduction projects related to heavy-duty diesel engines in a new NOx Remediation Measure (NRM). The structure of the measure is similar to the Carl Moyer Program that provide grants for cleaner-than-required engines and equipment. Eligible projects must reduce NOx, and those reductions must be permanent, surplus, and quantifiable.

REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION: CARB requires the Governing Board formally approve District acceptance of the funds and participation in the program.

SUMMARY: This item awards an amount not to exceed \$94,211 in Carl Moyer Program funds to Gall Brothers General Engineering to retire one (1) 1999 Tier 1 diesel excavator and replace with a new lower-emissions diesel excavator certified to the Final Tier 4 current emission standards.

BACKGROUND: AVAQMD received an application from Gall Brothers General Engineering (Gall Brothers) requesting grant funding under the Carl Moyer Program (CMP) towards retirement and replacement of older diesel-powered construction equipment. Gall Brothers proposes voluntary participation in the Carl Moyer Program in effort to reduce emissions. Grantee proposes to retire (1) 1999 JD Excavator to receive an amount not to exceed \$94,211 in grant funding to off-set the costs to purchase one (1) new 2017 CAT Excavator with the cleanest off-road technology. Staff has evaluated the project pursuant to the Carl Moyer guidelines and applicant is eligible to receive a maximum of 45 percent toward the replacement costs. The new equipment proposed in this project replaces the operation of the existing equipment creating significant emission reductions of 1.75 tons/yr. claimed for 3 years project life. Early fleet turnover provides emission reductions that help the Valley towards attainment of the national ambient air quality standards.
